



CAMP MONTESSORI 2010 Primary Level (2-6 years)

1. **June 7-18** **Community Action Camp** – Students will learn about responsibility to themselves and their community, participating in yoga, gardening, and animal care, as well as community action opportunities. Students will participate in activities such as making lunches for homeless people and serving hot soup on a food line with their families. The camp will culminate with a family yoga experience on Friday, 6/18.

2. **June 21-July 2** **Sports Camp** - Students will participate in a variety of sporting activities including physical fitness, individual and team sports, and also meet competitive athletes. Families are invited to attend a 51's game as a group. Students will enjoy a field trip of bowling at Sunset Lanes and participate in a Field Day to round out this active-filled camp.

3. **July 5 -16** **Nature Exploration Camp** – Students will study nature by developing a school yard habitat and participating in the Junior Park Ranger Program with the Lake Mead National Park Service. They will explore our Montessori botany and zoology curriculum to support their activities. Fun lessons with insects, plants, and animals will keep the students engaged and enthralled!

4. **July 19 –30** **Marine Biology Camp** - Students will learn about marine life through hands-on activities and research. Some activities include touching a live octopus, participating in an “Ocean Olympics”, and making our own tide pools.

5. **August 2-13** **Practical Life Camp** – Students will build life skills through activities such as cooking, sewing, woodshop and photography. After the first week, families will be invited to a craft show from 2-3 and after the second week, families will be invited to a family share day to enjoy hors d'oeuvres while students offer practical life services. This camp's field trip will find students making their own pizzas at Papa Johns.

6. **August 16-20** **Theater Camp** – Students will explore various aspects of theater, including set design, puppet creations, and performance. The camp will conclude with a presentation for families on Friday, August 20th.

7. **August 23-27** **School Closed** - for preparation for the new school year.

Students will continue to learn with Montessori materials in classrooms daily and also enjoy special projects to excite the imagination and stimulate the application of knowledge. Tuition for a two-week camp is \$360.00 per camp. Field trips are optional and may require an additional fee. Camp #6, a one-week camp, is \$180.00. The camp schedule is 8:30am to 3:30pm. Before school care is available 7:30-8:30am for \$30 per camp and after school care is available until 5:30pm for \$60 per camp. Tuition for the entire two week session will be due at the beginning of each camp session, no partial enrollment or partial payments will be accepted. A registration fee of \$20 per camp or \$50 for summer is due for students not registered during the 2009/10 school year. *Students who are five years old by 9/2010 and are strong swimmers may participate in an afternoon free swim opportunity (12:30-2:30 daily) with Club Sport for an additional \$30 per week.
